What is your background/How did you get involved in this business?

Combining entrepreneurial spirits, along with backgrounds in construction and project management, David Rossi and the Johner Family partnered to bring Johner Paving & Asphalt to Spearfish. They met while Rossi was putting in the Top Shelf Development in Spearfish, as Johner & Sons did the dirt work on site. Together they recognized a need for asphalt and paving in the area to service future developments, municipality needs, commercial expansions and residents.

What inspired the start of your business?

In 2021 we purchased 18+ acres of land in the Spearfish Industrial Park off of First Street. After an exhaustive, nationwide search we found the perfect plant in Kentucky. It had all the potential and capabilities we hoped to bring to spearfish. In two weeks seven of us had it dismantled and trucked home to be cleaned, painted, reconstructed and upgraded!

What does a typical day at your business look like?

Paving is for early risers as the asphalt plant production process starts around 5am in the summer season and ends around dinner time but, we try to leave weekend time for family and fun! The winter schedule is less rigorous, which is great for winter enthusiasts, or snowbirds, and in turn hours run longer when we can pave/produce!

What is one thing people may not know about your business?

Many don't know that our plant operator, Josh Kirchner was a middle school and high school

What makes your business unique?

We are willing to train, seeking a mindset that develops a skill set. Our success is not just the owners, and it is not just the employees but rather the synchronicity of both!

What opportunities do you see for your business's future?

One of the biggest complaints surrounding technology is change and the fear associated with switching up a process that seems to work fine. We are not burdened with decades of experience doing things a certain way and we embrace, invite and invest in technology, which is a huge opportunity. Our control house is state of the art and fully automated, not to mention that we can produce and store multiple types of asphalt mix each day so as to efficiently and effectively serve the varied needs of our customers.

What is your business's motto/slogan?

Paving driveways to highways and the things in between!

How does your business give back to the Spearfish Community?

We believe that giving back in the community and to others is an integral part to the circle of life and business, whether that be in the form of time, money or both!

Is there anything else about you or your business that you would like to share?

2023 was our first operational season both producing asphalt and paving for customers.

This fact exemplifies two things; being open to opportunities with a conviction to learn the unknown and to train and connect with those who can take your career down so many paths you never considered, and that Johner Paving believes in the abilities of its employees.

What is one of the biggest challenges your business has faced?

Obviously, there is a huge learning curve to starting a new business, especially in an industry subset where you personally have not worked before. But that doesn't mean it can't be done! The challenges we face exist on a pendulum, and regularly feel out of our control. For one day it is a mechanical issue such as the burner won't ignite, and the next day it can be a family emergency for someone and the following day it rains. As business owners, we all face the highs and lows of challenges, but it is the desire to offer a quality service to help a customer complete a project on time and on budget and the act of working together as a community to support an end goal that makes working through the challenges worthwhile.

With our eyes on expansion, we anticipate a staff of 20 along with subcontractors for the 2024 paving season.

What is one of your business's successes to date?

We are thankful for the developers, municipalities and generals who have given us an opportunity to show what we can do. We consider paving Spearfish Mountain, Deer Mountain Village Road, Miller Ranch Road and roads in Skyridge to be great successes of our first year in business. We are additionally thankful to the local municipalities who have worked with us to accomplish their paving needs/goals.
